Annunciation of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** Parish



Hello friends,

Before my main word for this week, let's clarify something. Moving on. This weekend we've got an important passage from the Letter of James, sometimes tied to the question "am I saved by faith or am I saved by works?" Incidentally, this is sometimes set up as one of the primary contentions between Catholics and Protestants (especially Lutherans), but that's for a different lecture, so to speak. The important thing for James is that our works (what we do, how we fill our schedule and manifest that we are Christians) are a necessary extension of our faith. Put another way, the relationship with Christ comes first, how we live it flows naturally out of it.

This brings me to one of my favorite St. Paul lines (Ephesians 4: 11-13): "He gave some as Apostles, others as prophets, others as evangelists, others as pastors and teachers, to equip the holy ones for the work of ministry, for *(continued on page 2)*
