
Annunciation of the Blessed Birgin Mary Parish



Hello friends,

First, an FYI on some daily Mass adjustments: October 16's Mass is moved from 5:15 to 12:10 for the Fall Dinner; October 22's 5:15 Mass is cancelled for Fall Ministry Days, and October 31's 8:00 Mass in Coon Valley is moved to 5:15 to act as a Vigil Mass for All Saints' Day. Viroqua's All Saints' Masses will be on November 1 at 8:00 and 12:10. And now for some meandering reflection.

On Wednesday evening this past week I sat down Viroqua's Finance Council for our bimonthly meeting (incidentally, "bimonthly" means both twice a month and every other month, perfectly not confusing) and a strange tension struck me: here we were talking about lighting, our financial position, and upcoming projects, while 1400 miles away some guy I don't know was stepping back from his pre-hurricane preparations in the calm before the storm to ask the question, "are we ready for this?" Let's see if I can define that tension a bit more – on the one hand, here we were settling down to the very real and very important work of administering the parish's resources (Big Problems don't make Little Problems go away) – we had a very local job to do, and we were getting down to do it. On the other hand, the lifeand-death stakes of our Floridian friends gave our local work some perspective.

I think it's important to make real room for both of these realities. If I forget about the very tangible Big Problems and difficulties people are dealing with, I can turn local molehills into disproportionate mountains. At the same time, if I am so wrapped up in a crisis I don't have any real control over that I stall out and come to a stop, I miss doing the Needful Thing that's set very particularly and locally in front of me for me to do here and now. Hearing and even witnessing other people's very real crises (not to speak of our own crises) opens the door for gratitude, sympathy, and even compassion. Recognizing and acting on the Needful Thing brings about positive change and development (our word for it is "subsidiarity"). *(continued on page 2)*

(continued from page 1) Now for a big swing. This tension is perhaps especially important as we come up on elections next month. For better or worse, you and I are global citizens, and the results of November Fourth's election will have a real impact on our lives. It is good to be concerned about politics and to form and inform my conscience and mind to vote well – that is, to do what I can do. But unless you or I are in a position to do something about it, it is perhaps *not* good to be so concerned about politics that the outcome of any political race embitters me, isolates/cuts me off from my brothers and sisters, and blinds me to the Needful Thing I can actually do something about. Catholics are sometimes okay with Tensions, and that balance between participation/concern in Big Movements and earnest local action is a great example.

Advance Care Planning Workshops

If you could not speak for yourself, who would you want to make medical decisions for you? What would you want this person to know about your healthcare goals and values? Life is so unpredictable. We never know when an illness or injury will occur. That is why it is extremely important to write your wishes down.

An Advance Directive is a legal document that allows you to designate a person to make your healthcare decisions, **only if you cannot make them yourself!** It also allows you to include specific treatment preferences and instructions for your care. In collaboration, St. Mary's and The Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary churches will host two free Advance Care Planning Workshops. These workshops will address Catholic beliefs, treatment options and assist you in creating or updating your own Advance Care Plan.
