
Annunciation of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** Parish



Hello friends,

In case you were not in last weekend, I'd like to follow up on some of what I shared in my homily about renewal and pastoral planning. Two weeks ago, Fr. Derek Sakowski invited me to sit on a council supporting him in his work of studying and communicating the needs and resources of parishes throughout the Diocese. I expect that this will be a multi-year project whose practical ambition winds up with A) the rearrangement of parishes and pastorates and B) a healthy long-term treatment of both people and priests. A good example of this work is the collaboration we've already seen between Coon Valley and Viroqua – an arrangement that (I think effectively) respects the needs of both parishes as well as the resources we have available to us (personnel, pastorship, finances, etc.).

The central reality here is that the Diocese today is in a different place than it was three decades ago and where it will be a decade from now. For a while we've known there's a shortage of priests (the so-called "vocations crisis"), and more recently we've recognized a concurrent crisis in changing demographics (the "people crisis"): long-time parishioners are aging, a large portion of middle-aged parishioners and families have disaffiliated themselves from religious practice, and a surprising number of middle-aged and young parishioners and families are returning to or seeking out the Church for the first time. There's a strange tension here — many of you have experienced the deep question "what do I have to do to bring my (fill-in-the-blank) back?" At the same time, here and elsewhere we are witnessing the humanly-inexplicable phenomenon of folks responding to the Holy Spirit and integrating themselves into the life of the Church, seeking out a meaningful relationship with Jesus Christ and His people. All of this is to say that we are in a season of necessary change and development, (continued on page 2)

(continued from page 1) and I am curious, excited, and more than a little nervous (not the right word) to see how things shake out. Our job is to listen together for the voice of the Holy Spirit and try our darndest to follow where He leads.

It is telling that when Fr. Sakowski called me to invite me into this process (which I short-handedly refer to as "pastoral planning"), he specified clearly "I want you to help me with this process of renewal – I don't even think 'pastoral planning' is the right term for it." "Renewal" – that is an important word. The Lord is renewing His Church always. He has been for the last 1,970 years, and He will be for the next however-many years we have ahead of us. It is also telling that Bishop Battersby is inaugurating this process, roughly a year into his time as our Bishop, with a Mass of Reparation this coming Thursday (to which you are invited, 10:00 at the Cathedral), acknowledging and praying for restoration wherever harm has been done in our Church throughout our history. This is a healing and renewing process, and I invite you to join me in praying our way through it. If you have any questions along the way, I make the same offer I made last weekend – feel free to ask. I may not be able to give a full answer, but I'll endeavor to give a straight answer. God bless you!
