Annunciation of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** Parish



Hello friends,

I'd like to talk to you about chisels. First, some context – I've been building up my woodshop for about nine or ten years, ever since getting going in woodworking back in seminary. Back then, I used the well-outfitted cast-iron-filled student woodshop at the seminary, supplementing main fixtures with this or that tool as a need came up. Toward the end of seminary, I raided a cabinet maker's retirement sale for some basics – a router table, a miter saw, some gorgeous 8/4 cherry – all in the hopes of one day having a space just like I have now. With the helpful going-away gift of some ash from a lumber supplier in Wausau, one of my first woodshop projects here was a big old workbench to host most of my work.

These last few years, I've been arranging and rearranging my shop down in the rectory basement to suit my needs; and last week I took delivery of a new table saw with a few more safety features and steadier tracking to keep my fingers firmly attached. And yet for all of these bigger-ticket save-up-for-a-while implements and tools, my favorite piece of shop equipment is a simple set of chisels. Chisels are at once delightful, terrifying, and a point of pride. They're delightful in the precision and nuance they offer – the shaping of a workpiece, tight edgework, and careful finishing of a joint to bring two pieces together. Chisels are terrifying in how efficiently they can run a long split through a troubled-over piece of wood. They're a point of pride in how they're maintained, the edge they keep, even in their storage. They're also one of those tools that need careful TLC to keep an edge – it's just as important to take the time to hone and sharpen their edges as it is to use them with practice and skill to give a clean cut and even to avoid a workday-ending injury. Over the last few months, I've been working away at the crucifix for Viroqua's current sanctuary renovation. In some ways this whole fixture is the prime motivation behind what we're doing, restoring and returning this powerful reminder of the vehicle for our salvation and what we celebrate in every Mass – thank the Good Lord that we still have the original from our construction 60-something years ago. I started off sanding down the original corpus and smoothing out a few hard lines, and it's now soaking up a last bit of finish. The original cross is too weather-worn for restoration, but thanks to that same lumber supplier I got my hands on some beautiful black walnut boards for a new one. These boards have been the ready recipients of the blows, scrapings, and cuttings of that very same set of chisels, and through this process that simple reminder to take the time to hone and sharpen has been coming up over and over. I tend toward the "I'll take care of myself after this or that job" camp, and these chisels are telling me powerfully how important it is to stay rooted, to return to the Lord and keep the tools in shape.


