
Annunciation of the **Blessed Virgin Mary Parish**



Hello friends,

As we round into Holy Week, I want to break down the liturgies we have coming up. Even more than Christmas, the movement around next weekend forms the heart of who we are and what we do – the movement from Jesus Christ's preaching and sign-working into His arrest and suffering (Holy Thursday), then into His death on the cross (Good Friday), then into His resurrection from the dead (the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday).

The three liturgies of Holy Thursday (the Mass of the Lord's Supper), Good Friday (the Passion), and the Easter Vigil really make up one long liturgy. The Holy Thursday Mass ends in suspense, lacking the customary blessing and dismissal and instead concluding with a solemn procession with the Blessed Sacrament out of the church into a side chapel. That evening we'll keep vigil until midnight in the chapel we've been using in Viroqua during construction – I need a few volunteers for each hourlong timeslot, but outside of volunteering please welcome the chance to stop in for fifteen minutes, an hour, whatever you'd like to keep watch with Jesus just as He invited His disciples to do in the garden.

Good Friday is the one day out of the year when there isn't a single Mass celebrated across the world. It picks up where Holy Thursday left off, with a simple procession into the church then three main movements: the reading of the Passion narrative, a veneration of the cross, and the reception of Holy Communion. The Blessed Sacrament is again removed from the church, and the prayer dismisses in similar suspense to how Holy Thursday ended.

And then comes Easter. The work of Holy Thursday and Good Friday has us in a somber state of mind and heart, all the way until dusk falls (continued on page 2)

(continued from page 1) on Saturday. This Mass starts with the church darkened fully, and into this darkness a single flame rises to light the Easter candle. This light slowly fills the church until we witness God moving through salvation history. This liturgy includes the reception of non-Catholics into the faith and the baptism of non-Christians into the Body of Christ, concluding finally the work of the last few months and welcoming us into the fifty days of Easter. It is beautiful, a lot, and well worth your time.

Finally, I want to invite you to one extracurricular liturgy – a Mass of Reparation on Wednesday evening (April 16). I want to follow Bishop Battersby into the work of renewal and rebuilding he is leading by recognizing and inviting the Lord into places where real hurt has been done within the Church. We'll begin with Stations as usual (in the church), then move into this Mass with a starting Litany of Reparation, as written and shared by the Bishop's office. If you are free to join us Wednesday evening, I warmly welcome you. It'll be a powerful warmup for the Triduum.

May God bless you as we move into this great and Holy Week!


