Annunciation of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** Parish



Hello friends,

First, a reminder that after Masses this weekend, I'll be heading up to the Boundary Waters for a week and a half. While I'm away, I have Frs. Bowe (Cashton), Reither (Genoa), and Kuhn (Richland Center) on retainer for hospital calls, emergencies, etc. This coming Friday is also the Solemnity of the Assumption, a Holy Day of Obligation. In addition to covering next weekend's Masses, Fr. Parr (a native son of Viroqua) will celebrate a Thursday 5:15 Mass in Coon Valley and a Friday 12:10 and 5:15 Mass in Viroqua. Hopefully one of those works in your schedule — otherwise look at one of those other priests' parishes for some alternatives.

Second, last week we celebrated one of my favorite feast days (I have several, and they do not compete with each other): the Transfiguration. This is a bit of a hinge in Jesus' public ministry – He takes Peter, James, and John up the mountain after they've been walking with him for a while, learning from him, watching him work miracles. By this point they know Jesus is a Big Deal – as far as people go, He's a strange and powerful one. Now that He's been established as part of their stories and as a Known Figure, He gives them a moment's glimpse of what's coming. For a heartbeat, Heaven meets Earth, Jesus is transfigured, Moses and Elijah appear, and Peter asks the very sensible question – "Lord, we've arrived. Can we just stay here?"

"Arrived" – big word. This mountaintop experience was beautiful and powerful and stirring for Peter & company – an experience of what Jesus had been and still was preparing them for, and it felt an awful lot like they had *(continued on page 2)*

He knew what was waiting for Him there, He knew just how far into the valley He still had to walk (those three days' "descended into hell" show just how far He was willing to go) before gathering His sheep up and leading them through the Resurrection to that very thing the Transfiguration was only hinting at. Anyhow, it's a beautiful scene. Jesus loved Peter and James and John right through that whole realization – "I haven't arrived yet" – and kept on leading them further up and further in until they finally did.

As I head off for a bit here, accept my gratitude for this season of climbing and descending with you. The Lord has a long road ahead for each and every one of us and a long road for us together before we arrive, and He's with us every step of the way. God bless you,


