## Annunciation of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** Parish



Hello friends,

Forgive me for shamelessly copying a good bit of last weekend's bulletin article, but A) I'm getting it together before I head out two weeks ago (super not confusing), and B) it's very important. This whole process is designed to provide the Bishop and his team the clearest vision of the Diocese and his people possible, and your participation will go a long way in helping there. So without further ado, the copy and paste. Feel free to re-read or disregard if you caught last weekend's...

I'd like to invite you all to one of our upcoming Listening Sessions (a part of the pastoral/strategic planning work at the Diocese, formally titled "Rebuild my Church"). Fr. Derek Sakowski is heading up this whole process and moving us now into the next phase – a series of townhall style evenings or afternoons to share vision with the people of the Diocese and (most importantly in reality and in intention) to hear from the people of the Diocese what their needs, fears, strengths, and hopes are. When we started this whole process up a year or so ago, there was some desire amongst the priests to jump right ahead to "what's the plan?" It's a fair request, and I'm grateful to have witnessed my brother priests and yourselves allowing it to be tabled. While it takes a lot more work to make something truly consultative, I've been impressed by the slow-and-steady work of sparking and building momentum rather than skipping gears to the end.

Anyway, we're shooting for some 40 of these Listening Sessions over the Fall and getting it started early in the Richland Center Deanery. Our first session will be right in Viroqua (I imagine Marian Hall) on September 7, at Noon. This will give folks a chance to get kids home after Mass as needed, grab a quick bite, or come in from other parishes' Masses. We want and I want you to come if you're a time/resource/position-invested stakeholder in the parish, if you're a there-every-weekend parishioner, if you're sporadic- or travelling-often parishioner, if you're... That's to say I just want you there. The whole goal of this process is to understand where we are as a People, to have the best sense we can of where the Holy Spirit is moving and where He is leading His people, and to take into clear account how the Lord is inviting us as a Diocese to respond to present and *(continued on page 2)*

LIBRARY CORNER What's the Smoke For? Is the title of a smaller paperback in our collection. It was published in 2014 and the author, Johan Van Parys, addresses questions that Catholics and non-Catholics might have about the liturgy. It is written in a question and answer format. As the title suggests, the use of incense is explained. The book is only 155 pages in length, but it does cover topics from Is it ok for altar servers to wear blinking sneaker?, to Is it appropriate to veil statues during Lent? In regard to funerals, What does the church really say about cremation; can a eulogy be included? Much of what is included in this book was not new or contradictory to me. One of the entries that caused me to take pause, however, has to do with the use of Latin in the Catholic liturgy. I did not realize that in the early church the Mass was offered in Greek, a language the majority of people did not understand. The use of Greek was gradually (continued on page 4)


