
Annunciation of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** Parish

(continued from page 1) have a lot of opportunity for control in my life, surrounded by flat walls and perfectly functional roofs, ignorant in the AC about the harshness of the hotter days we've had, with freedom to manage my schedule how I like – I find that stepping into the wilderness hones my sense of the present moment and wakes me up to the need to be intentional, to receive whatever is going on around me without competition or the need to manipulate circumstances. As my friend St. Paul says, "in my weakness, His strength is made perfect." It's an okay thing sometimes to be aware of our weakness and need of His grace.

Anyway, this is all to give you a heads up that I will be away for some time coming up (specifically August 11 -22). While I'm away, if a priest emergency should come up please reach out to Frs. Reither (at St. Charles in Genoa) or Bowe (Cashton, etc.) or Kuhn (Richland Center). This window also overlaps with a Solemnity and holy day of obligation – the Assumption on August 15. We'll have Fr. John Parr coming down to take us through that full solemnity into the weekend. You can attend one of our Masses here or head over to our neighbors for a workable time. While the weekend's schedule remains unaffected, our Assumption schedule stands:

- August 14 at 5:15 in Coon Valley (Vigil Mass)
- August 15 at 12:10 and 5:15 in Viroqua

LIBRARY CORNER. I do not read a lot of nonfiction, but when I do, it is generally historical in nature. As I was organizing the shelves a few months back <u>The Priest Barracks</u>: <u>Dachau</u>, <u>1938-1945</u>, by Guillaume Zeller caught my eye. I put it aside and a month or so later started to read it. I don't think you need to be a history buff or an expert on priestly life to appreciate this title; having said that, it was not an easy read for me. It might be because it was originally written in French by Zeller in 2015 and then translated by Michael J. Miller in 2017. t may also be due to the heaviness of this point in our world's history. I did start and stop reading it a few times. Some parts I read more quickly than others but reread the ending a couple of times. Yes, the horrors of concentration camp life are described, but these descriptions do not seem to overpower the story itself. The author also makes a point of describing both the heroic virtues and the human weaknesses of this very specific group of prisoners. The setting of this story is the Nazi concentration camp Dachau, three barracks out of thirty occupied by clergy from 1938 to 1945. The majority of the nearly *(continued on page 4)*


